Senseless Slaughter:

The shooting of an Arizona congresswoman, Gabrielle Giffords and perhaps as many as 20 others Saturday has included the killing of a 76 year old member of the church as he tried to shield his wife from the bullets. Dorwan and Mavy Stoddard are described as active members of the church who went to many people in their area to care for the needy and were the church's "benevolence committee" Jessica Knapp, a member of Mountain Avenue congregations said,"This is going to be a huge hole in our congregation. They were our benevolence committee. They did the job fantastically. Instead of just writing checks, they would go meet with people and find out what was going on in their lives and what their needs were."

"If there was a men's work day at church, Dorwan Stoddard didn't just show up; he organized it," Knapp said. "If the baptistery was leaking, we called Dorwan.,"

We need to pray for this family as well as for the recovery of the congresswoman, five others who have already been confirmed dead, and the other wounded victims including Mavy Stoddard.
