We are forbidden to be partakers or have fellowship with those who use empty words, but instead we are to reprove them. Eph 5:6-11 Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience. 7 Be not ye therefore partakers with them. . . 11 And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them.
