Pictures Jesus the Servant

More emphasis on what Jesus did than what he said.

"Straightway" (Immediately, forthwith) used 42 times shows fast action.

Only one Old Testament quote from the author. (Mark 1:3).

Other OT quotes are from Jesus himself.

Probably written for readers from Roman background.

Like a series of snapshots of what Jesus did - activity and energy.

Vivid details (words). Names, times, numbers.

12 of 16 chapters begin with "And"

Hands of Jesus mentioned often (servant theme).

No genealogy of Jesus. Nothing about the birth of Jesus.

Few discourses.
