# Bible Search

## Questions for week of April 26

1. What royal death would cause no lament, but would be characterized as the "burial" of a donkey, dragged outside a city?
2. What nation's military personnel was of the opinion that their loss of a battle was due to God's power being more on elevated places than in level areas?
3. What ex-prisoners defied a "gag order" and spoke in the temple where they were apprehended by a captain and officers
4. What was the name of the first month of the Jewish year during the time of Moses? What was it called during the days of Esther?
5. What is the connection between "fearing God" and the length of a person's life?
6. Jeremiah urged Jews in Babylonian captivity to marry and have children. What do we know about his own wife and children?
7. What animal considers a certain metal as being like decayed timber?

## Answers for week of April 19

1. I found four passages that suggest that hills might hear what God says. Find at least three of them .  
**Answers:** 1. **Ezekiel 6:3** And say, Ye mountains of Israel, hear the word of the Lord GOD; Thus saith the Lord GOD to the mountains, and to the hills, to the rivers, and to the valleys; Behold, I, even I, will bring a sword upon you, and I will destroy your high places.
2. **Ezekiel 36:4** Therefore, ye mountains of Israel, hear the word of the Lord GOD; Thus saith the Lord GOD to the mountains, and to the hills, to the rivers, and to the valleys, to the desolate wastes, and to the cities that are forsaken, which became a prey and derision to the residue of the heathen that are round about;
3. **Ezekiel 36:6** Prophecy therefore concerning the land of Israel, and say unto the mountains, and to the hills, to the rivers, and to the valleys, Thus saith the Lord GOD; Behold, I have spoken in my jealousy and in my fury, because ye have borne the shame of the heathen:
4. **Micah 6:1** Hear ye now what the LORD saith; Arise, contend thou before the mountains, and let the hills hear thy voice.

2. Where do we find warnings about using measures that do not give full measure? Find at least three of the passages.  
**Answers:** 1. **Leviticus 19:35** Ye shall do no unrighteousness

in judgment, in meteyard, in weight, or in measure. 36 **Just balances, just weights, a just ephah, and a just hin**, shall ye have: I am the LORD your God, which brought you out of the land of Egypt.

2. Deuteronomy 25:13 Thou shalt not have in thy bag divers weights, a great and a small. 14 Thou shalt not have in thine house divers measures, a great and a small. 15 **But thou shalt have a perfect and just weight, a perfect and just measure shalt thou have:** that thy days may be lengthened . . .

3. Proverbs 11:1 - A **false balance** is abomination to the LORD: but a **just weight** is his delight.

4. Proverbs 16:11 A **just weight and balance** are the LORD'S: all the weights of the bag are his work.

5. Proverbs 20:10 **Divers weights, and divers measures, both of them are alike abomination to the LORD.**

6. Amos 8:4 Hear this, O ye that swallow up the needy, even to make the poor of the land to fail, 5 Saying, When will the new moon be gone, that we may sell corn? and the sabbath, that we may set forth wheat, **making the ephah small, and the shekel great, and falsifying the balances by deceit?** 6 That we may buy the poor for silver, and the needy for a pair of shoes; yea, and sell the refuse of the wheat? 7 The LORD hath sworn by the excellency of Jacob, Surely I will never forget any of their works.

3. The king of Judah destroyed the brass serpent made by Moses (because it had become an object of worship), but his contemporary in Israel was imprisoned by Shalmaneser of Assyria for not giving his usual yearly "present", and also for communicating with the Egyptian king. What is the name of that "king of Egypt"? If you wish you may also name the kings of Israel and Judah.

**Answer: King So of Egypt.** He had been contacted by **Hoshea, King of Israel**, and this angered Shalmaneser of Assyria who not only disapproved of what looked like a potential rival alliance, but also had been neglected in the annual tribute (present) from Hoshea. **The king of Judah at the time Hoshea began his reign was Ahaz, and the king of Judah at the time Assyria besieged Samaria was Hezekiah, son of Ahaz**

Ken's note: "Nehushtan" in the passage below means "piece of brass". The brazen serpent had been the object that God used to bring healing to those bitten by serpents (Num. 21:8,9). It was now being worshipped. It was no longer a blessing to the people, but an object of idolatry. Misused, it was just another piece of metal.

(2 Ki 17:1-4) "In the twelfth year of Ahaz king of Judah began Hoshea the son of Elah to reign in Samaria over Israel nine years. 2 And he did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD, but not as the kings of Israel that were before him. 3 Against him came up Shalmaneser king of Assyria; and Hoshea became his servant, and gave him presents. 4 **And the king of Assyria found conspiracy in Hoshea: for**

**he had sent messengers to So king of Egypt, and brought no present to the king of Assyria, as he had done year by year: therefore the king of Assyria shut him up, and bound him in prison."**

(2 Ki 18:1-12) "Now it came to pass in the third year of Hoshea son of Elah king of Israel, that Hezekiah the son of Ahaz king of Judah began to reign. 2 Twenty and five years old was he when he began to reign; and he reigned twenty and nine years in Jerusalem. His mother's name also was Abi, the daughter of Zachariah. 3 And he did that which was right in the sight of the LORD, according to all that David his father did. 4 He removed the high places, and brake the images, and cut down the groves, and brake in pieces the brazen serpent that Moses had made: for unto those days the children of Israel did burn incense to it: and he called it Nehushtan. 5 He trusted in the LORD God of Israel; so that after him was none like him among all the kings of Judah, nor any that were before him. 6 For he clave to the LORD, and departed not from following him, but kept his commandments, which the LORD commanded Moses. 7 And the LORD was with him; and he prospered whithersoever he went forth: and he rebelled against the king of Assyria, and served him not. 8 He smote the Philistines, even unto Gaza, and the borders thereof, from the tower of the watchmen to the fenced city. 9 And it came to pass in the fourth year of king Hezekiah, which was the seventh year of Hoshea son of Elah king of Israel, that Shalmaneser king of Assyria came up against Samaria, and besieged it. 10 And at the end of three years they took it: even in the sixth year of Hezekiah, that is the ninth year of Hoshea king of Israel, Samaria was taken. 11 And the king of Assyria did carry away Israel unto Assyria, and put them in Halah and in Habor by the river of Gozan, and in the cities of the Medes: 12 Because they obeyed not the voice of the LORD their God, but transgressed his covenant, and all that Moses the servant of the LORD commanded, and would not hear them, nor do them."

**4.** Attention to (and continuance in) what two things was necessary for the salvation of Timothy and his audience?

**Answer: Timothy needed to give attention to his own life and to the doctrine (teaching).**

**1 Tim 4:16: Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them:** for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee. You may notice that the word "doctrine", prefaced by the definite article "the", indicates a body of truth that was to be taught. The truth of God differs from the doctrines of men (plural). I shudder when I hear people who say they have no use for doctrine. It tells me that they have mistaken doctrines of men for the doctrine of Christ.

**1 Timothy 4:13** Till I come, **give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine.** 14 Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on

of the hands of the presbytery. 15 Meditate upon these things; give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting may appear to all. 16 Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

**5.** Which is the better man, a poor but truthful man, or a wealthy liar? Prove it by scripture.

**Answer: The poor truthful man.**

**Proverbs 28:6 Better is the poor that walketh in his uprightness, than he that is perverse in his ways, though he be rich.**

Compare NASB: Better is the poor who walks in his integrity than he who is crooked though he be rich.

Cf.- Proverbs 19:22 . . . a poor man is better than a liar.

June Francis shared this quote from Matthew Henry, available online at <http://www.ccel.org/h/henry/mhc2/MHC20019.HTM>

A poor man, who wishes you well, but can promise you nothing, because he has nothing to be kind with, is better than a liar, than a rich man who makes you believe he will do mighty things, but, when it comes to the setting to, will do nothing. The character of the men of low degree, that they are vanity, from whom nothing is expected, is better than that of men of high degree, that they are a lie, they deceive those whose expectations they raised.

**6.** One house is described as being built of fir and cedar. What color was the bed in that house?

**Answer: Green.**

**Song of Solomon 1:1** The song of songs, which is Solomon's. . . 16 Behold, thou art fair, my beloved, yea, pleasant: also **our bed is green.** 17 **The beams of our house are cedar, and our rafters of fir.**

**7.** In regard to clothing, what do (1) Assyrian captains and rulers, (2) those who are in the courts of kings, and (3) Jesus, as dressed by Herod, have in common? Give references to all three.

**Answer: All wore "gorgeous" clothing.** (Interestingly, the Greek words for the two Luke references are different: endoxos and lampros)

**(1) Ezekiel 23:12** She doted upon the Assyrians her neighbours, **captains and rulers clothed most gorgeously**, horsemen riding upon horses, all of them desirable young men.

**(2) Luke 7:25** But what went ye out for to see? A man clothed in soft raiment? Behold, **they which are gorgeously apparelled, and live delicately, are in kings' courts.**

**(3) Luke 23:11** And Herod with his men of war set him at nought, and mocked him, and arrayed him in a **gorgeous robe**, and sent him again to Pilate.
