Questions for week of May 14, 2006

1. Who copied the law of Moses on stones in the presence of the Israelites?
2. Who killed a man that was digitally overly equipped (in reference to fingers and toes)?
3. What two famous Old Testament characters listed the sons of Israel and expressed his "blessing" upon them (and their descendants) concerning the future? (There may have been others but I know at least two.)
4. A high place (in the Old Testament) was an elevated place that was used for idolatrous practices. At one place it is said that the altars at one high place would have nuisance plants growing upon them and the altars are described in scripture as talking to the mountains. What did they say to them?
5. Who motivated David to make a numerical census of his nation?
6. What was the ORIGINAL name of a king whose eyes were put out?
7. Who had made him king and changed his name?

Answers for week of May 7, 2006

1. Who gave a name to another woman's child in honor of a women's wrestling match which she (the namegiver) felt that she had won?
Answer: Rachel. She named the son of her handmaid (Bilhah) Naphtali. Since Rachel and Leah, her sister, were in a childbearing "contest" to see who could have the most, Rachel saw this birth as being another "score" in the fight (wrestling) with Leah. Genesis 30:1 And when Rachel saw that she bare Jacob no children, Rachel envied her sister; and said unto Jacob, Give me children, or else I die. 2 And Jacob's anger was kindled against Rachel: and he said, Am I in God's stead, who hath withheld from

thee the fruit of the womb? 3 And she said, Behold my maid Bilhah, go in unto her; and she shall bear upon my knees, that I may also have children by her. 4 And she gave him Bilhah her handmaid to wife: and Jacob went in unto her. 5 And Bilhah conceived, and bare Jacob a son. 6 And Rachel said, God hath judged me, and hath also heard my voice, and hath given me a son: therefore called she his name Dan. 7 And Bilhah Rachel's maid conceived again, and bare Jacob a second son. 8 And Rachel said, With great wrestlings have I wrestled with my sister, and I have prevailed: and she called his name Naphtali.

2. At what place was the tabernacle erected and then the land distributed to the tribes of Israel?

Answer: Shiloh. This was not the first place the tabernacle was erected, but after it was erected here the land was divided.

(Josh 18:1-10 KJV) And the whole congregation of the children of Israel assembled together at Shiloh, and set up the tabernacle of the congregation there. And the land was subdued before them. {2} And there remained among the children of Israel seven tribes, which had not yet received their inheritance. {3} And Joshua said unto the children of Israel, How long are ye slack to go to possess the land, which the LORD God of your fathers hath given you? {4} Give out from among you three men for each tribe: and I will send them, and they shall rise, and go through the land, and describe it according to the inheritance of them; and they shall come again to me. {5} And they shall divide it into seven parts: Judah shall abide in their coast on the south, and the house of Joseph shall abide in their coasts on the north. {6} Ye shall therefore describe the land into seven parts, and bring the description hither to me, that I may cast lots for you here before the LORD our God. {7} But the Levites have no part among you; for the priesthood of the LORD is their inheritance: and Gad, and Reuben, and half the tribe of Manasseh, have received their inheritance beyond Jordan on the east, which Moses the servant of the LORD gave them. {8} And the men arose, and went away: and Joshua charged them that went to describe the land, saying, Go and walk through the land, and describe it, and come again to me, that I may here cast lots for you before the LORD in Shiloh. {9} And

the men went and passed through the land, and described it by cities into seven parts in a book, and came again to Joshua to the host at Shiloh. {10} And Joshua cast lots for them in Shiloh before the LORD: and there Joshua divided the land unto the children of Israel according to their divisions.

3. What does a person do to prove that they have small strength?

Answer: If a person just gives up when difficulty comes, they demonstrate their weakness. Strength in adversity comes through faith, and faith is "the victory." Prov 24:10 - If thou faint in the day of adversity, thy strength is small.

4. What king was taught by his mother to speak up on behalf of those who could not speak for themselves?

Answer: King Lemuel (Proverbs 31:1, 8-9)

1The words of king Lemuel, the prophecy that his mother taught him . . . 8 Open thy mouth for the dumb in the cause of all such as are appointed to destruction. 9 Open thy mouth, judge righteously, and plead the cause of the poor and needy. (Though the question was developed from the KJV, the NIV has almost the exact wording that was used: (NIV) Prov. 31:1 The sayings of King Lemuel-an oracle [1] his mother taught him: . . . 8 "Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. 9 Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy."

5. Just for fun . . . what passage in 1 Corinthians 15 could also be posted on a sign in the church nursery?

Answer: This question brought out the imagination! My answer was, "We shall not all sleep but we shall all be changed." I Cor. 15:51

But others saw excerpts in the chapter that also fit the nursery scene. :)
verse 1: I delivered unto you. . .
verse 8: born out of due time
verse 10: I labored more abundantly than they all
verse 49: we have borne
verse 58: ye know that your labour is not in vain

I hope you enjoyed reading this great chapter in the process of searching.

6. What three men encouraged Paul and Barnabas to focus on preaching to the heathen, while they themselves planned to go and preach to those of Jewish background?

Answer: About a year after Paul joined Barnabas in Antioch, the two men visited Jerusalem and conferred with the three "pillars" of the church there--the apostles **Peter and John, and James** the Lord's brother (Gal 2:1-10). The result of this conference was an agreement that the Jerusalem leaders would concentrate on the evangelization of their fellow Jews, while Barnabas and Paul would continue to take the gospel to Gentiles.

Gal 2:1-10 (See esp 7-10) Gal. 2:1 Then fourteen years after I went up again to Jerusalem with Barnabas, and took Titus with me also. 2 And I went up by revelation, and communicated unto them that gospel which I preach among the Gentiles, but privately to them which were of reputation, lest by any means I should run, or had run, in vain. 3 But neither Titus, who was with me, being a Greek, was compelled to be circumcised: 4 And that because of false brethren unawares brought in, who came in privily to spy out our liberty which we have in Christ Jesus, that they might bring us into bondage: 5 To whom we gave place by subjection, no, not for an hour; that the truth of the gospel might continue with you. 6 But of these who seemed to be somewhat, (whatsoever they were, it maketh no matter to me: God accepteth no man's person:) for they who seemed to be somewhat in conference added nothing to me: 7 But contrariwise, when they saw that the gospel of the uncircumcision was committed unto me, as the gospel of the circumcision was unto Peter; 8 (For he that wrought effectually in Peter to the apostleship of the circumcision, the same was mighty in me toward the Gentiles:) 9 And when James, Cephas, and John, who seemed to be pillars, perceived the grace that was given unto me, they gave to me and Barnabas the right hands of fellowship; that we should go unto the heathen, and they unto the circumcision. 10 Only they would that we should remember the poor; the same which I also was forward to do.
