

Imagine that you could not see these words or hear them spoken! This was the case for a young girl named Helen Adams Keller (1880-1968) who lost both her vision and hearing at the age of 18 months. At the age of 7, her parents decided to hire a teacher to try to help her to somehow overcome this seemingly impossible handicap. Her breakthrough story is one of the most remarkable cases in history...

Helen once asked her teacher, Anne Sullivan, what God's name was. Anne fingerspelled "G-O-D" into Helen's hand, and the young blind and deaf girl smiled. Helen finger-spelled her reply: "I ALWAYS KNEW who He was, and NOW I know HIS NAME!"

Amazing! And isn't this truth EXACTLY what we learn from God's Word? "For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities – His eternal power and divine nature – have been CLEARLY SEEN, being understood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse" (Romans 1:20 NIV).

Even though Helen Keller could not see or hear, she KNEW of God's existence because of "what has been made."

"I can see, and that is why I can be happy, in what you call the dark, but which to me is golden. I can see a GOD-MADE world, NOT a manmade world." Helen Keller.

## Answers for week of May 20, 2007

### Who Said It?

1. "Behold Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor."

#### Answer: Zacchaeus -- Luke 19:8

(Luke 19:8-10) "And Zacchaeus stood, and said unto the Lord; Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have taken any thing from any man by false accusation, I restore him fourfold. {9} And Jesus said unto him, This day is salvation come to this house, forsomuch as he also is a son of Abraham. {10} For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost."

2. "I go the way of all the earth; be thou strong therefore and show thyself a man." Answer: David -- 1 Ki 2:1-2

(1 Ki 2:1-3) "Now the days of **David** drew nigh that he should die; and he charged

Solomon his son, saying, {2} I go the way of all the earth: be thou strong therefore, and show thyself a man; {3} And keep the charge of the LORD thy God, to walk in his ways, to keep his statutes, and his commandments, and his judgments, and his testimonies, as it is written in the law of Moses, that thou mayest prosper in all that thou doest, and whithersoever thou turnest thyself:"

**3.** "I will not let thee go, except thou bless me."

Answer: Jacob -- Gen 32 :24-28

(Gen 32:23-28) "And he took them, and sent them over the brook, and sent over that he had. {24} And Jacob was left alone; and there wrestled a man with **him** until the breaking of the day. {25} And when he saw that he prevailed not against him, he touched the hollow of his thigh; and the hollow of Jacob's thigh was out of joint, as he wrestled with him. {26} And he said, Let me go, for the day breaketh. And he said, I will not let thee go, except thou bless me. {27} And he said unto him, What is thy name? And he said, Jacob. {28} And he said, Thy name shall be called no more Jacob, but Israel: for as a prince hast thou power with God and with men, and hast prevailed."

**4.** "Hath the Lord indeed spoken only by Moses? Hath he not spoken also by us?"

#### **Answer: Miriam and Aaron**

(Num 12:1-3) "And Miriam and Aaron spake against Moses because of the Ethiopian woman whom he had married: for he had married an Ethiopian woman. {2} And they said, Hath the LORD indeed spoken only by Moses? hath he not spoken also by us? And the LORD heard it. {3} (Now the man Moses was very meek, above all the men which were upon the face of the earth.)"

5. What punishment is threatened by God against those who think their lips are "their own" and that no one is over them?

Answer: To cut off their lips and tongue. (Psa 12 KJV) "To the chief Musician upon Sheminith, A Psalm of David. Help, LORD; for the godly man ceaseth; for the faithful fail from among the children of men. 2 They speak vanity every one with his neighbour: with flattering lips and with a double heart do they speak. 3 The LORD shall cut off all flattering lips, and the tongue that speaketh proud things: 4 Who have said, With our tongue will we prevail; our lips are our own: who is lord over us? 5 For the oppression of the poor, for the sighing of the needy, now will I arise, saith the LORD; I will set him in safety from him that puffeth at him. 6 The words of the LORD are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. 7 Thou shalt keep them, O LORD, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever. 8 The wicked walk on every side, when the vilest men are exalted."

6. What prominent Bible character lived in a fort for a while?

#### Answer: David (verse 9)

2 Samuel 5: 7 Nevertheless David took the strong hold of Zion: the same is the city of David. 8 And David said on that day, Whosoever getteth up to the gutter, and smiteth the Jebusites, and the lame and the blind that are hated of David's soul, he shall be chief and captain. Wherefore they said, The blind and the lame shall not come into the house. 9 So **David dwelt in the fort, and called it the city of David**. And David built round about from Millo and inward. 10 And David went on, and grew great, and the LORD God of hosts was with him

**7.** What king burned his oldest son as a sacrifice?

#### **Answer: King of Moab**

2 Kings 3:4 And **Mesha king of Moab** was a sheepmaster, and rendered unto the king of Israel an hundred thousand lambs, and an hundred thousand rams, with the wool. . . .26 And when the king of Moab saw that the battle was too sore for him, he took with him seven hundred men that drew swords, to break through even unto the king of Edom: but they could not. 27 Then **he took his eldest son that should have reigned in his stead, and offered him for a burnt offering** upon the wall. And there was great indignation against Israel: and they departed from him, and returned to their own land.

**8.** What unauthorized burnt sacrifices were made at Tophet?

# Answer: Sons and daughters of children of Judah.

(Jer 7:30-32) "For the children of Judah have done evil in my sight, saith the LORD: they have set their abominations in the house which is called by my name, to pollute it. {31} And they have built the high places of Tophet, which is in the valley of the son of Hinnom, to **burn their sons and their daughters in the fire; which I commanded them not, neither came it into my heart**. {32} Therefore, behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that it shall no more be called Tophet, nor the valley of the son of Hinnom, but the valley of slaughter: for they shall bury in Tophet, till there be no place."

See also 2 Kings 23:10 And he defiled Topheth, which is in the valley of the children of Hinnom, that no man might make his son or his daughter to pass through the fire to Molech.
