Answers for week of July 12

More "cord" questions

1. What color is the spinal cord of man in a figurative description of the body?

Answer: Silver -

Eccl 12:6 Or ever the **silver cord** be loosed, or the golden bowl be broken, or the pitcher be broken at the fountain, or the wheel broken at the cistern.

This passage is a description of aging, and the parts of the body are described in picturesque language. The silver cord is the spinal cord.

2. What two men were killed that had owned camels with gold chains around their necks?

Answer: Zebah and Zalmunna Judges 8:21-26

Judg 8:21 Then Zebah and Zalmunna said, Rise thou, and fall upon us: for as the man is, so is his strength. And Gideon arose, and slew Zebah and Zalmunna, and took away the ornaments that were on their camels' necks....26 And the weight of the golden earrings that he requested was a thousand and seven hundred of gold; shekels beside ornaments, and collars, and purple raiment that was on the kings of Midian, and beside the chains that were about their camels' necks.

3. How is a triple-rope used to describe the power of unity?

Answer: It is not easily broken

Ecc 4:12 And if one prevail against him, two shall withstand him; and a threefold cord is not quickly broken.

4. Where is the joy of motherhood celebrated and described as the lengthening of the ropes anchoring a tabernacle?

Answer: Isa 54:1-3 - Sing, O barren, thou that didst not bear; break forth into singing, and cry aloud, thou that didst not travail with child: for more are the children of the desolate than the children of the married wife, saith the LORD. 2 Enlarge the place of thy tent, and let them stretch forth the curtains of thine habitations: spare not, lengthen thy cords, and strengthen thy stakes; 3 For

thou shalt break forth on the right hand and on the left; and thy seed shall inherit the Gentiles, and make the desolate cities to be inhabited.

5.Where is sadness described as the breaking of tent ropes?

Answer: Jer 10:19 Woe is me for my hurt! my wound is grievous: but I said, Truly this is a grief, and I must bear it. 20 My tabernacle is spoiled, and all my cords are broken: my children are gone forth of me, and they are not: there is none to stretch forth my tent any more, and to set up my curtains. 21For the pastors are become brutish, and have not sought the LORD: therefore they shall not prosper, and all their flocks shall be scattered.

6.What is the word used to pronounce calamity upon those who drag sin around as one might pull a cart with a rope?

Answer: Woe - -

Isa 5:18 Woe unto them that draw iniquity with cords of vanity, and sin as it were with a cart rope:

7. Whose wife received a burnt city from her father?

Answer: Solomon's wife, a daughter of Pharaoh

1 Kings 9:16 For Pharaoh king of Egypt had gone up, and taken Gezer, and burnt it with fire, and slain the Canaanites that dwelt in the city, and given it for a present unto his daughter, Solomon's wife.

How Do People Answer These Bible Questions?

An article written about the use of these questions in e-mail groups.

Sometimes I am asked about people like Billy and Dot and Warren and Barry and Jennie and others who have been long term regulars in this list. . . "How do they do it?"

One key is persistence. They did not give up in the beginning when my "twisted questions" were puzzling. They tried different words that meant the same thing as what I asked, but in different words. They tried combinations of words, often in an online concordance, and read passages to see if the context fit the question. Sometimes they would send an incorrect or incomplete answer and I'd ask them to try again, sometimes with a hint. Most of these people are not "professional" students of the Bible. Most are not preachers. But they seem to have a wonderful characteristic in common. . .they love a challenge and they like to study the Bible.

Sometimes they have to drop out for a while due to pressing matters in their lives. But many return, like moths to a light. It has been a joy to see people mature in their ability to sort out the clues and know when they have the answer. The first five people listed above are people I've had the opportunity to meet personally. All but Warren were met first on the internet.

I am hoping that these examples will encourage others to try these questions.
