**Only One Way Out**

Wabush, a town in a remote portion of Labrador, Canada, was completely isolated for some time. But recently a road was cut through the wilderness to reach it. Wabush now has one road leading into it, and thus, only one road leading out. If someone were to travel the unpaved road for six to eight hours to get into Wabush, there is only way he or she could leave: by turning around. \*

Each of us, through our wrong choices, arrives in a town called Sin. Once in Sin, we are trapped and doomed to destruction (Romans 6:23), unless we find a way out. As in Wabush, there is only one way out: a road built by God himself.

Jesus said,

“I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.”-- John 14:6

Jesus died on the cross to pay for our sins (Ephesians 1:7). Through His atoning sacrifice, we find the way out of Sin and into the Heavenly City (cf. Hebrews 11:16), where there is eternal life and eternal joy. Through the “curtain” of His flesh and His blood shed for our sins, Jesus has opened up a “new and living way” out of Sin into the Most Holy Place (Hebrews 10:19-20).

## “The Sin of Doing Nothing” by Frank L. Cox

*"Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin" (James 4:17).*

The meaning of this passage is clarified and enforced by some of Jesus' wonderful lessons.

**THE GOOD SAMARITAN** (Luke 10:25-37). The sin of the priest and Levite was that of passing by on the other side. The Samaritan commends himself to us because of his compassion and kindness -- love in action.

**THE RICH MAN AND LAZARUS** (Luke 16:19-31). The fault of the rich man consisted not in cruelty but in neglect to minister to the man who had been "laid at his gate." He did not do the good that was in his power to do (Proverbs 3:27).

**THE TEN VIRGINS** (Matthew 25:1-13). Though listed among the friends of the bridegroom, the five foolish virgins were barred because they had not prepared themselves for the occasion. The person who does not prepare his heart and life, in harmony with divine direction, will be confined to the dark-ness of

the outside.

**THE TALENTS** (Matthew 25:14-30). The third servant was not a criminal. He had not been wasteful. He had buried (preserved) that which had been given to him. His sin was the failure to put into circulation the sum that had been entrusted to him.

**THE SHEEP AND THE GOATS** (Matthew 25:31-46). The people on the right side of the throne were blessed because of the deeds of love they had done; the people on the left were lost because they had not rendered service. No man should entertain the idea that the Lord will bless him merely because he does no evil. Positive goodness, as well as negative, is divinely required.

But in order to take that road, one must first turn around. That complete about-face is what the Bible calls **REPENTANCE**, and without it, there's no way out of town.

Here is the complete way out of sin: place your faith and trust in Jesus Christ (Acts 16:30-31), turn from your sins in repentance (Acts 17:30-31), confess Jesus before men

(Romans 10:9-10), and be baptized (immersed) into Christ for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38). Then, we must continue to follow Jesus by seeking to follow Him faithfully (1 John 1:7).

Jesus said: "Enter by the narrow gate; for wide is the gate and broad is the way that leads to destruction, and there are many who go in by it. Because narrow is the gate and difficult is the way which leads to life, and there are few who find it." – Matthew 7:13-14

There is only One way out of Sin and that is His Way!

Won't YOU turn away from the road that leads to destruction and, through your trusting obedience, turn to Jesus, the Way that leads to eternal life?
