"To do righteousness and justice is more acceptable to the Lord than sacrifice," (Proverbs 21:3, ESV).

The faster you say those supposedly Siamese words the more it dawns on

you that you are saying something else:

Try it. You'll see. Though I suggest you not do it in company. They might wonder how many fries were in that happy meal.

It's so easy to take meaningful worship of God and turn it into nothing more than meaningless words, mere ritual. Words mean something only if you mean them.

Barber

A local barber became a Christian on a certain Sunday morning. Being excited about his new found faith, this man wanted to share the news about Jesus with all his customers.

The barber opened his shop on the Monday after his conversion and in walked a customer. The barber situated this man in the chair, put the apron on him, and then proceeded to get a pair of scissors from the counter. With scissors in hand the barber approached the man in the chair and said: "Are you prepared to die?"

The terrified customer leaped from the chair and escaped through the nearest door.

This story, which is said to be true, contains some interesting lessons. First, it reminds Christians about the need to be evangelistic (Mark. 16:15-16). Second, it reminds us to choose our words carefully.

We may know what we mean, but

others may not (Colossians 4:5-6). Third, a time will come when either we die (Hebrews 9:27) or the Lord will return (2 Thessalonians 1:7-10). The question posted by the barber is very important so I am going to put it to you, dear reader. Are you ready to die?

If you are not sure about your relationship with God, please study the following items.

Without faith we cannot please God (Hebrews 11:6).

We cannot be a child of God without repentance (Luke. 13:3).

We must confess that Jesus is the Son of God (1 Timothy 6:12; Acts 8:36-38).

We must also be baptized into Christ (Galatians 3:27) for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; Acts 22:16) and then "walk in the light" (1 John. 1:7).

Ancient Israelites apparently made the mistake of offering sacrifices while living in an unjust and unrighteous manner.

But, God requires more than meaningless words, uttered like a mantra; he requires a heart, and a mind, and a life.

We bow before someone far greater than the king of Siam. And when we do so thoughtlessly, we are in more danger than simply making ourselves look foolish. This Sunday when you worship him, make sure that your words and your living coincide. Otherwise, the goose might be overdone.
